## FYUGP-GAUHATI UNIVERSITY

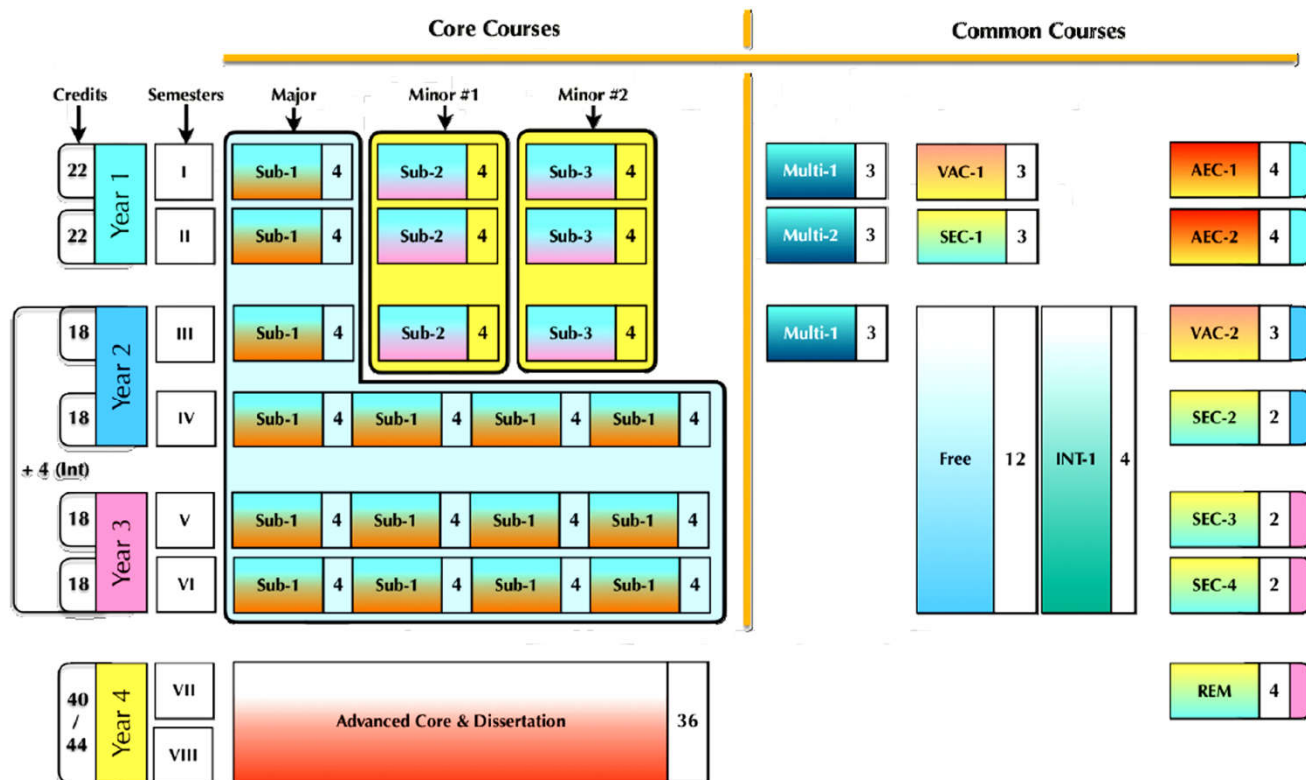
The **Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)** under Gauhati University is based on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The policy recognizes that higher education plays an extremely important role in promoting human as well as societal well-being. The policy also endeavors developing India as envisioned in its Constitution - a democratic, just, socially conscious, cultured, and humane nation upholding liberty, equality, fraternity, and justice for all. NEP 2020 notes that "given the 21st-century requirements, quality higher education must aim to develop good, thoughtful, well- rounded, and creative individuals

The undergraduate degree programme in the **FYUGP** will have courses spread across Eight semesters. A typical semester will comprise a minimum of 15 to 18 weeks of academic work that will translate into 90 actual teaching days. Two consecutive (one odd and one even) semesters will make up an academic year. A UG course shall be of Eight Semesters covering Four Calendar Years (Academic Sessions - August to July). The duration of the **Odd Semesters** (First, Third, Fifth, and Seventh) shall be 'August to December', and that of **Even Semesters** (Second, Fourth, Sixth, and Eighth) shall be January to July.

## PROGRAMME AND CURRICULAR COMPONENTS:

Overview and structure

The complete FYUGP consists of 8 semesters, to be completed in a minimum of 4 academic years. Each academic year has two semesters. Each semester has a maximum credit allocation of 22. All together the minimum credit requirements for a 3-year programme is 120 and for a 4-year programme, its 160. The minimum credit requirements for GU's FYUGP is as follows:

(a) Semester I: 22

- (b) Semester II: 22
- (c) Semester III: 22
- (d) Semester IV: 18
- (e) Semester V: 18
- (f) Semester VI: 18
- (g) Semester VII, VIII: 40
- (h) Total: 160

### **Course-wise credit requirements**

Below, we provide the minimum credit requirement for various courses along with a mention of their semesters.

#### **1) Core Course**

- a) First Major 60 (Semesters I-VI)
- b) Minor 12 (Semesters I-VI)
- c) Second Major (Double Major): 48 (Semesters I-VI)

#### **2) Common Course**

- a) Multidisciplinary: 9 (Semesters I-III)
- b) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): 9 (Semesters II-IV-VI)
- c) Valued Added Course (VAC): 6 (Semesters I-III)
- d) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) 8 (Semesters I-II)
- e) Internship 4 (in any Semester from III-V)
- f) Research Methodology: 4 (in any Semester in V-VII)

#### **3) For Honours and Honours with Research**

- a) Advanced Core, Dissertation: 36 (Semesters VII-VIII)

#### **Free credits**

In a 3-year duration of the FYUGP, a student can avail up to 12 free credits, 4 credits each in Semesters VI.VI. A student can either utilize these free credits to study another Minor or a course from 4th year of the course or can just not utilize them at all.

### **CURRICULAR COMPONENTS:**

The entire FYUGP curriculum is be divided into two parts - (a) Core Courses and (b) Common Courses, which are described below.

## Core courses

The core courses constitute Majors and Minors. Usually, a student will choose one Major subject and two Minor subjects. Different options are described in the next section. All core courses have a credit allocation of 4. Altogether, irrespective of any Major or Minor options, a student will necessarily need to study 21 courses with total credit allocation of 84 over a 3-year programme.

**Major Course:** The minimum credit requirements for a Major Course over a 3-year period is 60 which translates to 15 courses (papers).

**Minor Course:** The minimum credit requirements for a Minor Course over a 3-year period is 12 which translates to 3 courses (papers).

**Second Major Course:** Provided a student has a Major Course with 60 credits, s/he can convert one of her Minor Courses to a Second Major only with a credit allocation of 48, in that case, s/he gets a degree with Double Major and Minor

So, In general, the total credit requirements of 84 in core courses translates to a single Major and two Minors. But a student can choose otherwise as well.

## Common courses

As the name suggests these courses will have to be studied by all students of FYUGP. Together the common courses have a credit allocation of 36 divided over five subdivisions.

## They are

- (a) Value Added Courses (VAC): Total Credits 6
- (b) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): Total Credits 8
- (c) Multidisciplinary Courses: (MDC) Total Credits 9
- (d) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): Total Credits 9
- (e) Internship: Credit 4

**A brief description of these courses is given below.**

- **Multi-disciplinary Courses (MDC)**

These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects-(1) Natural and Physics Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (i) Library, Information, and Media Sciences, (iv) Commerce and Management, and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses is of Class XII.

Each student needs to take at any three courses, each with 3-credits from these five sub-groups during Semesters 1-3

- **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)**

This is an 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication).

Each student needs to complete two courses of 4-credits each-One from English Usage and the other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. These courses have to be taken during Semesters 1-2.

- **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)**

These are various skill courses with a total credit allocation of 9. In our structure, we shall have four skill courses starting from Semester 1 and in Semesters 4-6.

- **Value Added Courses (VAC)**

The VAC courses will come from four subgroups (1) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness All together they will have a credit allocation of 6.

Each student will have to take any two courses, each of 3-credits, from any three groups during Semesters 2 & 3. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.

- **Internship**

All students are to carry out an internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out in any semester during Semesters 3-6. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.

### **FYUGP First Year: SEMESTER COURSE**

- Sessional examinations of both Odd & Even Semesters will be held as per G.U. Guideline
- Semester End examinations for both Odd & Even Semesters will be held as per G.U. Examination Schedule



## **ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

### **Before the Result of H.S, is declared**

- Students must register their names on the Samarth Portal (<https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in/>)
- Students must upload his/her photo, signature, Aadhaar Card, and Income Certificate (only for Fee Waiver Category Students) In the portal. An income Certificate issued by Circle Officer only will be acceptable.

### **After the Result of H.S. is Declared**

- Students must login to the Samarth portal again and must select College name (Luitparia College), and Subjects.
- After the final submission of the Application, students must take a printout of the Application form and submit the same to the College along with all the documents uploaded on the portal.
- A detailed Merit List will be published on the Samarth Portal as well as on the College Portal ([www.lpcollege.ac.in](http://www.lpcollege.ac.in)) within the stipulated date

### **On the Day of Admission**

- Students must bring the following documents in Original for verification
  - Mark Sheet and Pass Certificate of the last Examination.
  - HSLC Certificate/ Admit for age verification.
  - Registration Certificate of AHSEC/GU
  - Aadhaar Card
  - Cast Certificate Gap Certificate / Migration Certificate Disability Certificate. (if any)
  - Certificates of Games, Sports, and Cultural Activities. (District level or higher) (if any).

# A candidate intending to get admitted under the **Fee Waiver** category must bring (1) a copy of a postcard-size photograph taken while planting a sapling by the candidate, and (2) an income Certificate issued by the Circle Officer in **Original**.

## **ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION**

- A student who has passed the 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from a recognized institution
- Admission to the FYUGP will be based on the preference of Major, if any. In case a student does not want to opt for any Major, s/he will be admitted on the basis of preferences of the subject combinations.
- Admission to a Programme or Major will be subject to availability of the subject and capacity of a college/department.

- No student shall be eligible for admission to a Programme in any discipline under the FYUGP unless s/he fulfills the pre-requisites of courses as fixed by the university.

### **RESERVATION**

The statutory reservation policy of the Government of Assam shall be followed in case of selection of eligible candidates for admission.

### **ATTENDANCE**

- Students must attend his/her classes in all subjects regularly as per Gauhati University Regulations.
- Continuous absence of 15 days without genuine reason in a class is enough for cancellation of his/her admission.

### **ADMISSION SCHEDULE:**

For Admission Schedule, candidates are advised to visit the Samarth portal as well as on the college website regularly.

**No Admission will be allowed after schedule dates.**

### **IDENTITY CARD**

An identity card will be issued to each student which is to wear on neck during the college hours. A fine of Rs. 100/-will be charged for re-issue of Identity Card. In every academic session, a new identity card will be issued.

### **LIBRARY CARD**

Every student is provided a library card with the facility to borrow two books at a time. But a student with a Major course can borrow four books at a time. All books are to be returned within a maximum of 15 days. There is a reading room which facilitates to go through study books, newspapers and journals etc.

**GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE**

1. Great emphasis is laid on discipline and character building and students are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline subject to the rules and regulations of college.
2. The students admitted to the college must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authorities. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, irregular clearance of college fees, showing discourtesy to the teachers and staff members and any offences may make students liable for disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, forced transfer and even expulsion from the college.
3. **All forms of ragging in college campus are strictly prohibited by the Govt. and strong disciplinary actions as indicated in St.No.2 above may be taken if anyone found to be involved directly or indirectly in ragging.**
4. Students Union and all other associations shall abide by the rules and regulations, the college administration may prescribe from time to time.
5. Any notice desired to be pasted or circulated by the students anywhere within the college or other places will need the prior permission / approval of the Principal. Nothing can do in the college campus without the knowledge and permission from the college authority
6. No students shall loiter in the college premises and disturb the teaching atmosphere. Free time is to be properly utilized in the reading room within library and in the common room.
7. Parents and Guardians are reminded to keep watch on their wards progress in studies and general conduct. The College expects parents/guardians to co-operate with the college authorities in the matter related to their progress in education. Their co-operation is solicited especially to ensure a regular attendance.
8. Students suffering from any infections, disease need not be sent to college. In such cases, parents are requested to bring the matter to the college authorities by any means.
9. The students indulging in damaging of college property will be responsible for renovation of the damage property and suitable disciplinary action may be initiated against such student.
10. Truancy will be viewed very seriously.
